

Dr. Aaron Miller graduated from Brandeis University in 1964 and received his MD degree from New York University School of Medicine in 1968. Following his residency in neurology at the Albert Einstein College of Medicine, he received additional postdoctoral training in neurovirology and immunology at the Johns Hopkins University School of Hygiene and Public Health and at Einstein. During this time, he was the recipient of a fellowship from the National Multiple Sclerosis Society.

In March, 2004, Dr. Miller assumed the position of Medical Director of the Corinne Goldsmith Dickinson Center for Multiple Sclerosis at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai. For 23 years prior to that, he headed the Division of Neurology at Maimonides Medical Center in Brooklyn, New York, where he continued to serve as co-director of the Multiple Sclerosis Care Center until 2015. Dr. Miller is also a Professor of Neurology at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai in New York.

Dr. Miller became the chief medical officer of the National MS Society in October 2001 and continues to serve as its senior medical advisor. He is a past president of the Consortium of MS Centers and was the first president of the Section on Multiple Sclerosis of the American Academy of Neurology. He has participated in numerous clinical trials of new treatments for MS. He has authored two books, *Multiple Sclerosis in Clinical Practice*, with colleagues Dr. Fred Lublin and Dr. Patricia Coyle, and *Neuroimmunology* as part of the *What Do I Do Now?* series with Dr. Tracy DeAngelis. He has also published more than 85 articles in peer-reviewed journals, as well as many chapters on MS and other subjects in neurology.

Dr. Miller is also very active with the American Academy of Neurology (AAN). He served as a member of the Board of Directors from 2009 through 2013 and currently serves as secretary of the Board. He recently completed 10 years as editor of *Continuum*, the bimonthly continuing education publication of the AAN, and currently serves as editor of Continuum Audio.

Dr. Miller has been cited by *New York* magazine in its list of top doctors for the years 2008-2012 and has been included in Castle Connolly's *America's Top Doctors* during the years 2009-2016.
