

Alberto Ascherio, MD, DrPH, is a Professor of Epidemiology and Nutrition at the Harvard T. H. Chan School of Public Health and a Professor of Medicine at the Harvard Medical School. After graduating in medicine at the University of Milan, he practiced medicine and public health in Latin America and Africa for several years before moving to Boston, where he received a doctoral degree in epidemiology in 1992 and joined the faculty at the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health. His current research is primarily devoted to finding the causes of multiple sclerosis (MS), Parkinson disease, and amyotrophic lateral sclerosis. Among the most notable discoveries to which he has contributed in MS are the key role of infection with the Epstein-Barr virus, vitamin D insufficiency, and cigarette smoking as risk factors for MS, and the importance of vitamin D status as a determinant of MS progression.
