Ron Milo is the Chairman of the Department of Neurology and Director of the Multiple Sclerosis Clinic at the Barzilai Medical Center in Ashkelon and the Ben-Gurion University of the Negev, Israel.

Dr Milo obtained his medical degree from the Hebrew University Hadassah Medical School, Jerusalem. He completed his training in neurology at the Assaf Harofeh Medical Center, Tel Aviv University, and a Research Fellowship in neuroimmunology at the University of Maryland, Baltimore in MD, USA, where he studied the immunomodulatory properties of interferon-beta and glatiramer acetate in MS. He has been involved in basic and clinical research in MS, and has accumulated more than 25 years of experience in conducting clinical trials in MS and other neurological conditions.

Dr Milo has authored more than 350 papers, reviews and abstracts. He is extensively involved in teaching neurology and neuroimmunology to medical students, residents and neurologists nationally and internationally, and has received several teaching awards.

Dr Milo's scientific and clinical interests include the immunology of MS, new therapies in MS, immunomodulation, cognitive dysfunction and the conduction of clinical trials in MS. He is the Secretary of the Israel Society of Neuroimmunology and the Chairman of the Medical Advisory Board of the Israel MS Society. He is also a member of the American Academy of Neurology (AAN), the European Committee for Treatment and Research in Multiple Sclerosis (ECTRIMS) council, and the Scientific Panel on MS of the European Academy of Neurology (EAN).
