

Dr Claire Rice is a Consultant Senior Lecturer in Multiple Sclerosis Neurology at the University of Bristol, UK.

Dr Rice was awarded a BA (Hons) in Neuroscience from Cambridge University in 1996 and completed her undergraduate medical training in Cambridge, qualifying in 1998. Dr Rice's post-graduate neurology training was based at Frenchay Hospital in Bristol although she also worked at the National Hospital for Neurology and Neurosurgery, Queen Square, London and at Royal United Hospital in Bath. Her doctoral research under the supervision of Professor Neil Scolding in Bristol explored the potential of bone marrow-derived cell therapy for multiple sclerosis (MS). She was awarded a PhD from University of Bristol in 2008.

Claire works with the MS team at the Bristol and Avon MS Unit (BrAMS), Southmead Hospital and runs a specialist clinic in neuroinflammatory disorders as well as participating in the general neurology service in Bristol. Her research interest focuses on the role of the bone marrow microenvironment in the pathophysiology of MS and development of cell-based therapies to improve repair in progressive disease.
