

Professor Laura Airas obtained her medical degree at the University of Turku, in Turku, Finland. After graduation, and after finishing her PhD on Immunology and Cell biology, she specialized in neurology, obtaining a neurology consultant status in 2001 and docentship in neurology in 2007. She founded her own research group in 2002, studying the immunology of pregnancy in MS. Today she is leading a research group whose main aim is to elucidate the pathological mechanisms of progressive MS by using a multi-modal approach which includes PET-imaging, advanced MRI imaging, and soluble biomarker analysis. Laura Airas has authored over 100 peer-reviewed articles in international journals. In 2015 she received the international Grant for Multiple Sclerosis Innovation (GMSI) award, and in 2016-2017 she spent an academic year as a visiting professor at Yale University. In 2017 she became the first Professor of Neuroimmunology at the University of Turku, and she is an Adjunct Professor of Neurology at Yale University, USA, since July 1st 2019.
